- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.
- WARNING: Ensure that the appliance is switched off before replacing the lamp to avoid the possibility of electric shock.

- Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.
- The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed.
- Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous situation.
- The appliance must not be installed behind a decorative door in order to avoid overheating. (This is not applicable for appliances with decorative door.)
- Only use the temperature probe recommended for this oven. (for ovens provided with a facility to use a temperature-sensing probe.)
- The microwave oven shall not be placed in a cabinet unless it has been tested in a cabinet.
- The microwave oven must be operated with the decorative door open. (for ovens with a decorative door.)

UTENSILS



Personal Injury Hazard. It is hazardous for anyone other than a competent person to carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.

See the instructions on "Materials you can use in microwave oven or to be avoided in microwave oven." There may be certain non-metallic utensils that are not safe to use for microwaving. If in doubt, you can test the utensil in question following the procedure below.

Utensil Test:

- Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- 2. Cook on maximum power for 1 minute.
- 3. Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
- 4. Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

Materials you can use in microwave oven

UTENSILS	REMARKS
Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of browning dish must be at least 3/16 inch (5mm) above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.
Dinnerware	Microwave-safe only. Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Glass jars	Always remove lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.
Glassware	Heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.
Paper plates and cups	Use for short-term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for a short-term cooking only.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.
Plastic	Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Should be labeled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften, as the food inside gets hot. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by package.
Plastic wrap	Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.
Thermometers	Microwave-safe only (meat and candy thermometers).
Wax paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture. Do not leave unattended while cooking."



Aluminum tray	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Food carton with metal handle	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Metal or metal-trimmed utensils	Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause arcing.
Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.
Paper bags	May cause a fire in the oven.
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.







- Never use the appliance without the turntable. Make sure that it is properly engaged. The turntable can turn clockwise or anti-clockwise.
- 2. Never place the glass tray upside down. The glass tray should never be restricted.
- 3. Both glass tray and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
- 4. All food and containers of food are always placed on the glass tray for cooking.
- 5. Never restrict the movement of the turntable.
- If glass tray or turntable ring assembly cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorized service center.

OPERATION

Setting the Clock

- 1. Press " Clock " once and then "00:00" will display.
- Press number keys to enter the time.
 The maximum value is 23:59.
 Example: To set the clock to 12:10, please press "1,2,1,0" in turn.
- 3. Press " Clock " to confirm. The clock is set.
- 4. If the entered number is not within the range of 0:00-23:59, the setting is invalid.

Note

 In the process of clock setting, if the "Stop/Clear" button is pressed or if there is no operation within 1 minute, the oven will return to the former setting.

Setting the Kitchen Timer

- 1. Press " **Timer** " and then "00:00" will display.
- 2. Press number keys to enter the desired time. The maximum time value is "99:99".
- 3. Press " **OK/Start+30s** " to confirm. The timer starts counting down.

Note

• There are not any other programs during kitchen timer.

OPERATION (CONTINUED)

Speedy Cooking

- In standby mode, press "OK/Start+30s" to cook food with 100% power level for 30 seconds. Each press on the same key can increase 30 seconds and the maximum time value is 99:99.
- In standby mode, pressing number keys 1 to 6 let you quickly select a cooking time from 1 to 6 minutes with PL10. You can press "OK/Start+30s" to increase the cooking time during cooking. The maximum time value is 99:99.

Note

 Time can't be increased by pressing "Start/+30sec." in weight defrost ,auto menu and the first stage of multi-stage.

Defrost by Weight

- Press " Weight Defrost " and then the screen will display "dEF1".
- 2. Press number keys to enter the weight of food. The range of weight is 100-2000g.
- 3. Press "OK/Start+30s" to start defrosting.
- 4. Once defrosting has finished, the buzzer will sound five times.

Defrost by Time

- Press "Time Defrost" and then the screen will display "dEF2".
- 2. Press number keys to set the desired defrost time. The maximum value is 99:99.
- 3. Press " OK/Start+30s" to start defrosting.
- 4. Once defrosting has finished, the buzzer will sound five times.

Note

The default power level is PL3, it can't be changed.

Multi-Stage Cooking

Notes

- Up to two cooking stages can be set in multi-stage cooking.
- If you set defrost function, it will work in the first stage.
- Auto menu can't be set as one of the multi-stage.

Example: Defrost food for 5 minutes and then cook with 80% microwave power for 7 minutes

- Press "Time Defrost" and then the screen will display "dEF2".
- 2. Press "5", "0", "0" to set the desired defrost time of 5 minutes.
- 3. Press "Time Cook" and then press "7", "0", "0" to set the cooking time.
- 4. Press " Power " and then "PL10" will display.
- 5. Press "8" to set the power level of PL8.
- 6. Press " OK/Start+30s " to start cooking.

Memory Function

You can save the settings for a dish in the memory and call it up again.

- 1. Press " 0 " to select memory 1-3 procedure. "1", "2" and "3" will display in order.
- 2. If the procedure has been set, press " **OK/Start+30s** " to start working. Otherwise, please continue to set.
- After finishing the setting, press "OK/Start+30s" once to save the procedure.

Example: Set memory 2 (cook food with 80% microwave power for 3 minutes)

- 1. In standby mode, press "O" twice.
- 2. Press "**Time Cook**" and then press number keys "3", "0", "0" in order.
- 3. Press " Power " and then press number keys "8".
- Press " OK/Start+30s" to save the setting and "2" will display.
 Press " OK/Start+30s" again to start cooking with memory 2.

Notes

- If the power is not cut off, the procedure will be saved all the time.
- Auto menu can not be set in memory function.

Lock Function for Children

You can use this function to prevent children from accidentally turning the oven on.

To activate the lock:
In satndby mode, press and hold "STOP/Clear" for three seconds. A long beep sounds, " _ _ _ _ _ " will display.

To deactivate the lock:
In locked mode, press and hold "STOP/Clear" for three seconds. A long beep sounds denoting that the lock has been released.

OPERATION (CONTINUED)

Auto menu

- Press a menu key repeatedly to choose the weight of the menu.
 For example, press "Popcorn" twice and "100" will display.
- 2. Press "OK/Start+30s" to start cooking

ECO Function

To enter ECO mode:

In standby mode, and the oven door is closed,

press "Stop/Clear" once. The screen will turn off.

To cancel ECO mode:

In ECO mode, pressing any key or open the oven door will cancel it.

CLEANING

Be sure to unplug the appliance from the power supply.

- 1. Clean the cavity of the oven after using with a slightly damp cloth.
- 2. Clean the accessories in the usual way in soapy water.
- 3. The door frame and seal and neighbouring parts must be cleaned carefully with a damp cloth when they are dirty.
- 4. Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
- 5. Cleaning Tip---For easier cleaning of the cavity walls that the food cooked can touch: Place half a lemon in a bowl, add 300ml (1/2 pint) water and heat on 100% microwave power for 10 minutes. Wipe the oven clean using a soft, dry cloth.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

	NORMAL
Microwave oven interfering TV reception	Radio and TV reception may be interfered when microwave oven operating. It is similar to the interference of small electrical appliances, like mixer, vacuum cleaner, and electric fan. It is normal.
Dim oven light	In low power microwave cooking, oven light may become dim. It is normal.
Steam accumulating on door, hot air out of vents	In cooking steam may come out of the food. Most steam will escape form vents, some steam may accumulate on cooler surfaces like the oven door. This is normal.
Oven started accidentally with no food in.	Do not run the unit without any food inside. It is very dangerous.

TROUBLE	POSSIBLE CAUSE	REMEDY
Oven cannot be started.	(1) Power cord is not plugged in tightly.	Unplug. Then plug again after 10 seconds.
	(2) Fuse blowing or circuit breaker trips.	Replace fuse or reset circuit breaker (repaired by professional personnel of our company)
	(3) Trouble with the electrical outlet.	Test outlet with other electrical appliances.
Oven does not heat.	(4) Door is not closed properly.	Close door properly.


COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION

Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged.

Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the waveguide cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

INSTALLATION

1. Select a level surface that provide enough open space for the intake and/or outlet vents.



- (1) The minimum installation height is 85cm.
- (2) The rear surface of appliance shall be placed against a wall.

Leave a minimum clearance of 30cm above the oven. A minimum clearance of 20cm is required between the oven and any adjacent walls.

- (3) Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.
- (4) Blocking the intake and/or outlet openings can damage the oven.
- (5) Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible.
 - Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.

2. Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequency on the rating label.



Do not install oven over a range cooktop or other heat-producing appliance. If installed near or over a heat source, the oven could be damaged and the warranty would be void.

The accessible surface may be hot during operation.

This document sets out the terms and conditions of the product warranties for Westinghouse Appliances. It is an important document. Please keep it with your proof of purchase documents in a safe place for future reference should there be a manufacturing defect in your Appliance. This warranty is in addition to other rights you may have under the Australian Consumer Law.

- 1. In this warranty:
 - (a) 'ACL' or 'Australian Consumer Law' means Schedule 2 to the Competition and Consumer Act 2010;
 - (b) 'Appliance' means any Electrolux product purchased by you and accompanied by this document;
 - (c) 'ASC' means Electrolux's authorised serviced centres:
 - (d) 'Westinghouse' is the brand controlled by Electrolux Home Products Pty Ltd of 163 O'Riordan Street, Mascot NSW 2020, ABN 51 004 762 341 in respect of Appliances purchased in Australia and Electrolux (NZ) Limited (collectively "Electrolux") of 3-5 Niall Burgess Road, Mount Wellington, in respect of Appliances purchased in New Zealand;
 - (e) 'Warranty Period' means the period specified in clause 3 of this warranty;
 - (f) 'you' means the purchaser of the Appliance not having purchased the Appliance for re-sale, and 'your' has a corresponding meaning.
- 2. Application: This warranty only applies to new Appliances, purchased and used in Australia or New Zealand and is in addition to (and does not exclude, restrict, or modify in any way) other rights and remedies under a law to which the Appliances or services relate, including any non-excludable statutory guarantees in Australia and New Zealand.
- 3. Warranty Period: Subject to these terms and conditions, this warranty continues for in Australia for a period of 12 months and in New Zealand for a period of 12 months, following the date of original purchase of the Appliance.
- 4. Repair or replace warranty: During the Warranty Period Electrolux or its ASC will not service the Appliance. If the Appliance is defective, you should return the Appliance to the place of purchase for a replacement. You agree that any replaced Appliances or parts become the property of Electrolux.
- 5. Travel and transportation costs: Subject to clause 7, Electrolux will bear the reasonable cost of transportation, travel and delivery of the Appliance to and from Electrolux or its ASC. Travel and transportation will be arranged by Electrolux as part of any valid warranty claim.
- Proof of purchase is required before you can make a claim under this warranty.
- 7. Exclusions: You may not make a claim under this warranty unless the defect claimed is due to faulty or defective parts or workmanship. This warranty does not cover:
 - (a) light globes, batteries, filters or similar perishable parts;
 - (b) parts and Appliances not supplied by Electrolux;
 - (c) cosmetic damage which does not affect the operation of the Appliance;
 - (d) damage to the Appliance caused by: (i) negligence or accident;

- (ii) misuse or abuse, including failure to properly maintain or service;
- (iii) improper, negligent or faulty servicing or repair works done by anyone other than an Electrolux authorised repairer or ASC;
- (iv) normal wear and tear;
- (v) power surges, electrical storm damage or incorrect power supply;
- (vi) incomplete or improper installation;
- (vii) incorrect, improper or inappropriate operation;
- (viii) insect or vermin infestation;
- (ix) failure to comply with any additional instructions supplied with the Appliance;

In addition, Electrolux is not liable under this warranty if:

- (a) the Appliance has been, or Electrolux reasonably believes that the Appliance has been, used for purposes other than those for which the Appliance was intended, including where the Appliance has been used for any non-domestic purpose;
- (b) the Appliance is modified without authority from Electrolux in writing;
- (c) the Appliance's serial number or warranty seal has been removed or defaced.
- **8. How to claim under this warranty:** To enquire about claiming under this warranty, please follow these steps:
 - (a) carefully check the operating instructions, user manual and the terms of this warranty;
 - (b) have the model and serial number of the Appliance available;
 - (c) have the proof of purchase (e.g. an invoice) available;
 - (d) telephone the numbers shown below.
- 9. Australia: For Appliances and services provided by Electrolux in Australia: Electrolux goods come with guarantees that cannot be excluded under the Australian Consumer Law. You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and for compensation for any other reasonably foreseeable loss or odamage. You are also entitled to have the Appliance repaired or replaced if the Appliance fails to be of acceptable quality and the failure does not amount to a major failure. 'Acceptable quality' and 'major failure' have the same meaning as referred to in the ACL.
- 10.
